With a focus on capital and infrastructure improvements, we are bringing our properties into the 21st century in order to meet the needs of our youth and families.

- Improvements to camps for safety, privacy, and accessibility at campsites and program areas
- Improvements to swimming facilities, upgrades to restroom and shower facilities, and improved technology including Wi-Fi access
- New program facilities including STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) education, shooting sports, water sports, skilled trades education, and more
- New program equipment and updates to exisiting equipment including water sports, shooting sports, mountain bikes, patrol cooking, climbing, and more
- Upgrades to camp & trail maps, directional signage, and virtual tours
